Dear Mr. Middlebrook:

In pursuance of our conversation of yesterday in regard to the necessary arrangements for supplying statements for visa purposes for Dr. Robert Meyer of Berlin, I should like to present the following information:

HATTE WITH

The appointment of Dr. Robert Meyer as Clinical Associate Professor of Gynecology and Obstetrics has been recommended by me, approved by Dean H. S. Diehl and President Ford, and passed by the Board of Regents. The circumstances included the arrangement that special funds were to be obtained from outside the University of Minnesota.

The funds as presently available are as follows: The Emergency Committee in Aid of Displaced Foreign Physicians, New York City, have guaranteed \$1,500.00 a year for two years. They cannot make commitments for longer periods, but have personally assured us that they are by no means limiting their interest to this period.

Dr. I. Rubin of New York City has guaranteed us \$2,000.00 immediately and has agreed to take equal responsibility with the others to be mentioned for the permanent support of Dr. Meyer. Dr. Rubin is well able to do this.

Dr. Meyer has already been offered the special lectureship at the International Cancer Congress in September, which is worth about \$500.00, and the President of the American Association of Gynecologists and Obstetricians has agreed to use his influence to obtain their lectureshap which is worth a similar amount.

The American Gynecological Society, the senior group in this field, took up the matter unofficially last week at their meeting at which I was present. They have unofficially given us assurance of their support and advised that we go ahead with the project. Dr. Arthur Curtis, one of the senior Gynecologists of Chicago, has agreed to act as Treasurer and the members of the Society are being canvassed for individual donations at once.

Several other offers of support are now being made Since we have a two year program clearly defined,

Dr. J. M. Hundley, Professor of Gynecology at the University
of Maryland, Dr. H. F. Traut of Cornell, Dr. I. Rubin of
New York City and I have agreed amongst ourselves to be
responsible for Dr. Meyer's support.

I trust that this is satisfactory and that it will allow you to inform Dr. H. S. Diehl to that effect so that we may proceed at once with the details of bringing Dr. Meyer to this country.

I am now in process of arranging to get funds from the above sources turned over to the University of Minnesota.

Sohr geehrter Herr Professor:

Please excuse me if I write this in English. I can make myself more certainly clear in English than in German.

Obstetrics and Cynecology at the University of Minnesota. This carries with it the rank of Clinical Associate Professor and a salary of U. S. \$3,000.00 per year. An official letter from Dr. H. S. Diehl, Dean of McGloal Sciences, confirming the offer, is enclosed.

There is what you would consider a small, but an active service in the University Hospital and I have set eside a small laboratory for you here. Two other teaching units, the Minneapolis General Hospital and the Ancker Hospital of St. Paul are associated. The Department of Pathology at the University, under the headship of Dr. E. I. Bell, is an excellent one. So far as material and associates are concerned, I think that the situation is satisfactory. You would no could have quickly added to our material, reference material from the various departments in this country. Small, but I think ample funds can be obtained for the support of your work. Library facilities are complete.

Part of the available salary will be made up of special lectureships and I should like to have you consider the U.S. \$3,000.00 as including these. This will be more than ample for your expenses here. Dr. Trout and I have discussed the details at length and I think that you can trust us to set in your best interests.

I om hoping that you will spend your major time in Minneapolis, but it is already evident that you will be in great demand in this country. We already have requests from a number of Universities for short visits and I would are that you allow us to accept these. Again, I would ask that you let us make these arrangements and trust us to act in your behalf.

We shall be gied to have you come at any time you can arrange it. Dr. Traut will meet you on arrival in New York and we shall hope that you and Wrs. Mover will be our house guests in Minneapolis until you wish to establish yourselves here.
